Keeping a smart strike rate

If it seems like Smart Strike sires a stakes winner every weekend, that's because he does. Well, at least four consecutive weekends, stretching from mid-June to early July, he did. In that period of time he was represented by a total of six stakes winners.

On June 12, Smart Strike's sophomore daughter, Gold Strike, won the \$400,000 Labatt Woodbine Oaks. On the undercard that day at Woodbine, Hatpin won her first stake by taking the Alywow Stakes at six furlongs on the grass. Six days later, High Strike Zone took the Ark-La-Tex at Louisiana Downs for his second 2005 stakes triumph. The following weekend, the good Smart Strike three year-old colt, English Channel, easily won the \$500,000 Colonial Turf Cup in Virginia, while the venerable six year-old former Sovereign Award winner Soaring Free won the Scotts Highlander Handicap. The next

Sunday it was Smart and Classy's turn and the five year-old mare won her first black-type event, Eatontown Stakes (G3) on the Monmouth Park grass.

All told, Smart Strike has sired nine 2005 stakes winners, who have won a total of 16 stakes races, the most total stakes wins for any North American-based sire this year.

Seeking the Gold had a spectacular first half of the year as well, with ten stakes winners to lead all North American sires. Four of those stakes winners have won graded events: Seeking the Ante in the Nassau County Stakes (G2); Pleasant Home in the Bed o' Roses Breeders' Cup Handicap (G3); Wanderin Boy in the Mineshaft Handicap (G3) and Seeking Slew (via DQ) in the Kent Breeders' Cup Stakes (G3). Pleasant Home and Wanderin Boy are out of Pleasant Colony mares and are among the five stakes winners Seeking the Gold has sired out of such mares (the others include Cash Run and Pleasant Home's full sister Country Hideaway). Seeking Slew is at least the seventh stakes winner Seeking the Gold has sired out of daughter or granddaughter of Seattle Slew. That group also includes the successful stallions Mutakddim and his only U.S. grade one winning colt Cape Town.

Giant strides

Much has been written in recent weeks about the exploits of the Coolmore pair of Montjeu and Giant's Causeway. And with good reason. The Irish-based Montjeu indeed looks like the heir apparent to his sire Sadler's Wells with seven stakes winners, two Classic winners and two additional Classic-placed colts from his first crop.

Giant's Causeway had a similar impact on the 2005 European Classics with his first crop. He was represented by 2,000 Guineas (G1) winner Footstepsinthesand and triple group one winner Shamardal (French 2,000 Guineas, French Derby, St. James Palace Stakes) not to mention two of the top three in the Coronation Stakes (G1) at Royal Ascot, winner Maids Causeway and third place-finisher Mona Lisa.

Giant's Causeway, of course, stood his first season in Ireland so it's no surprise that's he's enjoyed the bulk of success in Europe. He has, however, also had some good American runners like the Florida Derby (G1) second Noble Causeway and Hilltop Stakes winner My Typhoon. The son of Storm Cat also has

some promising dirt two year-olds so far in 2005, namely Stonesider and First Samurai, from his first Kentucky-bred crop.

Stormy Atlantic began his stallion career in Florida before moving to Hill 'N' Dale Farm in Kentucky two years ago. The runners produced from his years in the Sunshine State continue to impress. In 2005 he has been represented by seven stakes winners including the grade three winning three year-old colt Indian Ocean and Sunshine Millions Oaks winner Hot Storm, who has also placed in several graded events this year. Indian Ocean and Hot Storm are members of Stormy Atlantic's third crop and his final Florida crop are juveniles of 2005. That group already includes four winners and Mystery Girl, third in Hollywood Park's Landaluce Stakes.

Prior to 2005, Slew City Slew had sired 328 winners, 31 stakes winners and 11 graded winners from 12 crops to race. But not one of those performers had ever won at the grade one level. With Lava Man's record triumph in the G1 Hollywood Gold Cup and Sis City's win in the Ashland back in April, Slew City Slew now has sired a pair of grade one winners in three months. The son of Seattle Slew has also been represented by the restricted stakes winners Jaguar City and My Sweet Sug as well as the Puerto Rican grade three winner City Flyer in 2005.

Concorde's Edge became the first unrestricted stakes winner out of a Boundary mare when he won the Gilded Time in course record time at Monmouth Park. The colt's dam, Pretty Boundary, is a foal of 1998 and a member of her sire's third crop. Claiborne recently announced that the 15 year-old Danzig stallion is being pensioned due to limited fertility.
