

# Sophomore Success

*New freshman emerging with early three-year-olds*

Talk about the exploits of the first crop sires of 2004 may be getting redundant. But, based on the returns so far in 2005, the progeny of the cream of that crop show now signs of slowing down. In fact, the group may have to make room for a few more "promising" members as Golden Missile and High Yield have sired good looking sophomores early in the new year.

Golden Missile actually had a pair of nice fillies among his six first crop juvenile winners last year: Sorrento Stakes (G3) winner Inspiring and Alcibiades Stakes (G2) third In Gold. While the former remains sidelined, the latter returned in early February with a second place showing in the Davona Dale Stakes (G2), albeit beaten by 16 lengths, then came within a nose of taking the Bonnie Miss Stakes (G2). Now the son of A. P. Indy has a serious colt in multiple 2005 stakes winner Going Wild. He won the San Miguel at six furlongs in January and then went wire to wire in the Sham at nine furlongs.

High Yield's first juvenile crop was a bit of disappointment with only nine winners from 79 foals and a 25<sup>th</sup> place ranking on the Freshman Sire list. But his Amazing Buy looks like the real thing after her win in the Busanda at Aqueduct. The \$350,000 Fasig-Tipton February purchase validated her name by easily handling a solid bunch of fillies and more can be expected as winter turns to spring.

More Than Ready, 6<sup>th</sup> on the first crop list last year, already has a pair of 2005 stakes winners. His juvenile stakes winner, More Moonlight, won her second blacktype event on New Year's Day by taking the Letellier Memorial at the Fair Grounds. Two weeks later, Portsea became her sires' fourth stakes winner when she crossed the line first in the Sandpiper at Tampa.

Chattahoochee War became stakes winner number three for War Chant with his score in the Grassy Hill Rise at Santa Anita. The colt is inbred to Roberto at 4 x 4, being out of a daughter of the Roberto grandson Sir Pekan, while War Chant is out of a Roberto granddaughter (Champion Hollywood Wildcat by Kris S.). He is the second unrestricted winner so inbred, joining multiple French group winner Risk Seeker. That runner also carried Roberto in the broodmare sire-line of the sire and in the sire line of the dam, at 3 x 2 in that instance.

Straw Hat is the third first crop stakes winner for Dixie Union after his win in the off-the-turf Black Gold at the Fair Grounds. His previous two stakes winners are out of Mr. Prospector-line mares (one by Robyn Dancer and one by Allen's Prospect), while Straw Hat is out of a direct daughter of Mr. Prospector. Dixie Union's second dam, She's a Talent is daughter of Mr. Prospector and therefore all three of his early blacktype winners are inbred to Mr. P, Straw Hat at 4 x 2, Im A Dixie Girl at 4 x 3 and United at 4 x 4.

Dixie Union's sire Dixieland Band was the leading broodmare sire of 2004, unseating Mr. P after seven years atop that category. Perhaps Mr. Prospector's daughters took it personally, as Straw Hat is already the fifth 2005 stakes winner out of a Mr. Prospector mare. The others include the graded winners Congrats and Rock Hard Ten.

With Maddy's Lion's win in the Jimmy Winkfield, the Maryland-based Storm Cat son Lion Hearted is also up to three first crop stakes winners. She is out of the Private Terms mare Maddy's Terms. Interestingly, third crop stallion Tactical's Cat's newest stakes winner, Virden, is also out of daughter of that Claiborne Farm stallion. Private Terms is now the broodmare sire of four stakes winners, with his first two emerging last year. Those two are by the Mr. Prospector son Not For Love and the Northrop stallion Northern Idol.

A sire son of Private Terms, Afternoon Deelites, has also made a bit of noise in recent months. Late last summer at Arlington he was represented by two new graded winners in Arlington Oaks winner Lovely Afternoon and Futurity winner Three Hour Nap. Now in 2005, he has Snack, who was being talked

about like a serious Kentucky Derby contender after his big win in the WEBN Frog Stakes at Turfway Park, but who suffered a life ending injury in the Santa Catalina Stakes (G2). All three of those runners are out of mares with a Nijinsky II connection. Snack and Lovely Afternoon are out of Nijinsky II granddaughters, the former out of daughter of Fred Astaire, the latter out of Green Dancer mare. Three Hour Nap is out of a daughter of Pilgrim whose dam, Fleur, is a sister to Nijinsky II. Afternoon Deelites had previously sired a stakes winner out of daughter The Minstrel, full brother to Pilgrim. Afternoon Deelites now stands at Clear Creek Stud in Louisiana after beginning his career at Airdrie Stud in Kentucky.

Daughters of Fred Astaire are quietly producing some useful runners. Seven of his daughters produced 2004 stakes winners, including the open winners Kaufy Mate and Anna Em. Overall, his daughters have produced 13 blacktype winners, the graded winner Casual Feat chief among those. **20B**
